## Repeater

- The club's 2-meter Master II repeater is down with controller problems. The club discussed options of fixing it or looking at replacements.
  - If we move forward with fixing the Master II, then parts will be hard to find as well as people willing to service it.
  - Our new fusion repeater does do analog; however, it will not perform well at the current site.
- The original purpose of the repeater fund was unclear and discussed on whether it was for a new repeater or a fusion repeater. Yet there was a general agreement that some of the repeater fund could go to replacement of the Master II, since the fusion repeater is almost set up.
- If we decide to replace the Master II, then we could sell it. There is a Riley County property tag on it, but Riley County Emergency Management gave it to MAARS. The repeater would probably be worth more as a working unit than for parts.
- Jon gave a presentation about repeaters and someone that could sell us a Motorola Quantar repeater for \$950. The costs of other parts that are needed and shipping makes the total for this Quantar around \$1,450. There would be lots of advantages to using a Quantar. However, the deal is extremely time sensitive.

  - In discussion the question came up of could this deal be too good to be true? Ryan and Ashley will quickly research the seller to make sure he is legitimate.
  - A vote was conducted on whether to move forward with the purchase contingent on verification through Ryan and Ashley's research. Jon will also be the front man on this purchase. Club voted and motion is carried.
